

Descendants of Henry E T Bratz

Generation 1

1. **HENRY E T¹ BRATZ** was born on 9 March 1810 in Germany. He died on 2 November 1872 in Wausau, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA. He married **JOHANNE WILHELMINA LOUISE NEUMAN** in 1842 in Germany, daughter of David Neuman and Louise (Unk). She was born on 11 May 1819 in Brallentin, Pyritz, Pomerania, Germany. She died on 14 December 1903 in Wausau, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA.

Notes for Henry E T Bratz:

Henry and Wilhelmina immigrated in 1858 with their five children, and claimed their homestead in Hamburg, Town of Berlin, Marathon County, Wisconsin. They had been "coaxed" to come to America by Wilhelmina's brother-in-law, Henry Beilke who had come to the Town of Berlin the previous year.

Germans began immigrating to Wisconsin and to Wausau in the middle 1800's so their sons would not have to serve in the German armies in those troubled years. The oldest real farm settlements were made by German farmers in the Town of Berlin area in 1856 and 1857. The men who went into the Town of Berlin, which then included Hamburg and part of Maine, came for the sole purpose of farming, intending to make a living thereby. They all had families when they came and it is learned that few, if any, ever emigrated there from.

The fathers or heads of the families usually stayed on the land, clearing and planting, and sent their sons to work out in the woods. With the money they earned, they would improve their buildings and holdings. In the first ten years after settling in the Town of Berlin there were a good number of farms growing in population, resulting in a faster growing township than any other one. Farmers felt they could not afford to pay the high price for horses and because horses were more expensive than oxen to keep, the ox team was used most everywhere.

The first farmer immigrants coming to Marathon County seemed to have been the William Thiele family. Thiele, with his wife and grown son, came in 1856. Four Barteld brothers: John, David, Gottlieb, and Frank, along with a relative by the name of Riemer all took land near Taegesville (then part of the Town of Berlin). The Carl Fehlhaber family came from Prosekell in the province of Posen, Germany, also in 1856. The family consisted of his wife, Ernestine, four sons: William, August, Herman, and Carl along with two daughters, one being Emelia, who later married Ludwig Zamzow. The immigration to this area had begun.

August W. Schmidt's family also arrived in 1857; however, he located here in the fall of 1856 on the 200 acres of land directly south of the church in Naugart. He bought this land from the government by a United States land warrant. In 1855, the territory had been surveyed. An old logging road led to approximately where Brokaw Corners are now and from there a trail followed the section lines, all of which had been staked during the survey. August Schmidt had left his family in Adams County for the winter months. He and a friend went to the Town of Berlin, built a log shack on the 200 acres, and later put up a log barn. Members of Mr. August W. Schmidt's family who followed him the next spring (1858) were his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Gottfried Schmidt, his brother, Frederick, and his sister, Ernestina.

August W. Schmidt was married in 1858 to Miss Charlotte Neumann, the sister of Mrs. Henry Beilke (Augusta Neumann) who came to the Town of Berlin in 1857, and to Mesdames Henry Braatz (Johanne Neumann), David Schoeneberg (Louisa Neumann), and Carl Schuster (Carolina Neumann).

Children born to the Schmidts included one daughter, Mrs. William Schoeneberg, and four sons, Robert, Albert, William, and Fred. The early log house was replaced with a more "modern" log dwelling. Mr. Schmidt was the Town of Berlin Clerk in the early days. When the county adopted the commission form of government, he was elected a commissioner, and when the county returned to the supervisor form of government, he was elected chairman of the township, serving for many years. In 1878 he was elected register of deeds and the family moved from the Town of Berlin to the city of Wausau. Schmidt also became a director of the German American Bank of Wausau.

In 1858 the family of Carl Schuster arrived from their home at Fuerstencse bei Doerlitz, Pommern, Germany, to Wisconsin after being coaxed by Carl's brother-in-law, Henry Beilke who had come to the Town of Berlin the previous year. Germany offered them little opportunity - but their new home was equally disappointing. They traveled by train to the City of Berlin, then by team to Wausau. "Footmobile" was mode of transportation through the dense forest from Wausau

to the Town of Berlin. The Schusters had five children. When they came they had August, then ten years old; William F., three years old; and a sister still younger, who had to be carried all the way by Carl. Little William F., although only three years old, tramped most of the distance, and was carried only when he became very tired.

Henry Braatz, who had operated a cereal mill in Germany, and David Schoeneberg, who had been a herder of sheep, and both of whom were brothers-in-law of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Beilke also accompanied them. Mr. Beilke, before coming to America, had been a builder of stone roads. All four families stayed together in Beilke's small log house, until the Schuster, Braatz, and Schoeneberg families could erect log homes of their own.

Naugart, Wisconsin was named after the city of Naugardt in Pomerania, Germany. The post office at Naugart was established on October 18, 1866, with August Schmidt as postmaster. The office was located in his home one-fourth mile south of the Naugart settlement. Mail was carried on horse back from Wausau by Henry Bratz once a week. There was no such a thing as home deliveries, so all patrons for miles around would call for their mail at the Schmidt home.

Henry Bratz was elected Chairman of the Town Board the fourth day of April 1865 and resigned April 13th. Ferdinand Erhard accepted the appointment to fill the vacancy of the Board as Chairman.

Notes for Johanne Wilhelmina Louise Neuman:

After Henry's death in 1872, Wilhelmina moved to Wausau in 1883 to stay at the home of her son, Robert A. Bratz. She died at his home and the funeral services were conducted at his home by the Rev. F. Schaer. She is buried in Pine Grove Cemetery lot 12 block 14.

The Wausau Record newspaper recorded her death notice as "Mrs. Wilhelmina Braatz aged 84 years, died at the home of her son, Robert A. Braatz at 609 First Street, yesterday morning. Her principle ailment was the general debility consequent upon extreme age. The funeral will be held from the home at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon, Rev. R. Schaer officiating. Mrs. Braatz was born near Stargaird, province of Pomeraine, Germany, May 11, 1819. She came to this country in 1857 and with her husband settled on a farm in the town of Berlin. Mr. Braatz died in 1872 and in 1883 Mrs. Braatz moved to this city. She is survived by five children -- Mrs. Amelia Miller, Mrs. Matilda Kickbush and August and Robert A. Braatz of this city, and Gust. Braatz, of Merrill. The deceased was a most excellent woman and was held in high regard by all. Her death closed a busy and fruitful life."

Another newspaper article reported (translated from German): "Mother Braatz, Mrs. Johanne Braatz, nee Neumann, was born May 11, 1819 in Brallentin near Pyritz, Germany. She was a widow since 1892. She died December 14th and was laid to rest today. The deceased left Germany in the year 1858 with her husband and some of her children. She resided in Marathon County in 1858. In the thickness of the wilderness at that time they cleared a piece of land and became neighbors of the other pioneers. This was the beginning for the success of the county.

Unfortunately death robbed her of husband 41 years ago. It made her life even darker in the dark woods. Thank God in those days she saw not only the grave but also the open heaven. From there she obtained her energy to carry her cross so she never gave up hope. The children grew to the joy of their mother and competed with each other to return to their mother the love they had received. In the house of her youngest son, Mr. Robert Braatz and his son-in-law Mr. F. W. Kickbusch, she spent the last 20 years. The last years her life sounded like a song no one tires of hearing. In her silent corner present and past flowed together and became one. In her future, she saw Jesus Christ whom she loved very much. When her final hour came, she went quietly without pain into the arms of her Savior who had never left or forgotten her. Mother Braatz is dead but she lives because whosoever believes the word of God shall live ever though they may die. Three sons and two daughters, a son-in-law, a number of grand children and three sisters may rejoice at the fact that through death we live."

Henry E T Bratz and Johanne Wilhelmina Louise Neuman had the following children:

5. vi. ROBERT ALBERT BRATZ was born about 1859 in Berlin, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA. He died in 1927. He married FRIEDRICKE ANNA EMILIE MARQUARDT on 21 June 1885 in Wausau, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA. She was born about 1858. She died in 1941.

2. **MATHILDA ELVINE² BRATZ** (Henry E T¹) was born on 8 November 1843 in Germany. She died on 8 November 1912 in Wausau, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA. She married **JOHANN FREDERICK WILHELM KICKBUSCH** on 29 October 1864 in Berlin, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA, son of Martin Friedrich Kickbusch and Catherine (Unk). He was born on 25 January 1841 in Colberg, Pommerania, Prussia, Germany. He died on 20 November 1907 in Wausau, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA.

Notes for Mathilda Elvine Bratz:

Mathilda immigrated at the age of 14 with her family.

She was married by A. F. H. Gebhard, Minister of Gospel. The wedding was witnessed by A. Kickbusch and R. G. Plumer.

She and her husband, Frederick, resided at 216 Grand Avenue in Wausau, Wisconsin. She died in Wausau and was buried there in Pine Grove Cemetery. She was survived by four children and seven grandchildren. She was a member of St. Paul's Evangelical Church. She lived in Wausau since her marriage and died at her home following an illness of thirteen years with paralysis, the last stroke occurring three weeks before her death.

Notes for Johann Frederick Wilhelm Kickbusch:

Frederick immigrated about 1861. He was a pioneer merchant in Wausau, Wisconsin, having started in the lumber and manufacturing business. From 1877 to 1879 he was a member of the State Assembly of Wisconsin, having been elected on the Greenback Party ticket. He also was Ambassador to Germany. Frederick resided at 216 Grand Ave, Wausau.

Johann Frederick Wilhelm Kickbusch and Mathilda Elvine Bratz had the following children:

- i. EMMA³ KICKBUSCH was born on 16 November 1867 in Wausau, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA. She died on Unknown date. She married C H WEGNER about 1887. He was born about 1865. He died on Unknown date.

3. **AUGUST² BRATZ** (Henry E T¹) was born on 16 December 1845 in Germany. He died before 1917. He married **MARY JACOBI** on 22 July 1870 in Wausau, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA, daughter of Ferdinand Jacobi and Louise (Unk). She was born on 22 May 1845 in Germany. She died on 20 May 1917 in Wausau, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA.

Notes for Mary Jacobi:

Mary was about 26 years old when she immigrated with her parents and sisters. She died Sunday 20 May 1917 in Wausau, Wisconsin, and was buried there in Pine Grove cemetery, Wednesday 23 May. She died of paralysis and was survived by her two sisters, Mrs. Gustav Bratz and Mrs. Henry Keinbaum of Merrill, her seven sons and her three daughters. She died at the home of her oldest daughter, Mrs. Otto Mathie. Services were at the Otto Mathie home, Rev. E. C. Grauer, officiating.

August Bratz and Mary Jacobi had the following children:

4. **GUSTAV ADOLPH² BRATZ** (Henry E T¹) was born on 6 August 1852 in Pomerania, Germany. He died on 1 April 1937 in Merrill, Lincoln, Wisconsin, USA. He married **HENRIETTE JACOBI** on 29 March 1874 in Maine, Marathon, Wisconsin, USA, daughter of Ferdinand Jacobi and Louise (Unk). She was born on 21 February 1853 in Germany. She died on 10 December 1919 in Merrill, Lincoln, Wisconsin, USA.

Notes for Gustav Adolph Bratz:

Gustav came to Marathon County, Wisconsin, at the age of 4 with his family in 1857 to claim their homestead. They settled in Hamburg, about 10 miles north of Wausau.

Gustav Adolph Bratz married Henriette Jacobi Sunday 29 March 1874 in Hamburg (Town of Maine), Wisconsin, when he was 21 years old. August Jahns and Freidrich Kickbush were their witnesses at the marriage conducted by Fr. G. Reinicke, of Wausau.

Gustav and Henrietta began their family with their first six children being born in Hamburg. They then moved to "homestead" the farm on what became the city golf course and Riverside Park just on the edge of Merrill. Their final four children were born in Merrill. Later they moved into Merrill and lived at 101 Park Street.

"A founding father of Merrill, Gustav owned the first ice company in Merrill, did the only street cleaning by running a sprinkling system to keep the dust down on Main Street, owned and operated Riverside Park where he held picnics and dances, sold the park to the city, and it later became the city's only golf course." (From Nina Bratz's letter to the editor of the Merrill, Wisconsin, newspaper.)

"Friday 1 August 1890, George and Eva Strobbridge sold to Gustav and Henrietta Bratz of Merrill the entire Riverside Park area, i.e. Government Lot 3, Township 31N, Range 6 East. The level plain between the Wisconsin River and the hill was an ideal spot for a park and recreation area. It was named Bratz Park.

"Bratz erected a large all-purpose recreational hall with a stage at the east end. Dances were held there regularly with a small admission charge. Bratz's young daughter Tillie (Ottillie who later became Mrs. William Frank Wendt) played the organ. Well known bands in the Wisconsin Valley also played here.

"The rest of the park was free and available for church picnics, school picnics, and other gatherings. Here the Liederkrantz (a men's singing club), Saengerfests (music contests and concerts), public performances and festivals were held. These were similar to those held in Germany. Bratz's granddaughters, the Wendt girls, have told me how this was sort of a mini amusement park.

"The Anfin Chilsens lived directly across the river from the park so it was easy for their sons Walter, Joe, Norman and Harry to row across the river and observe or join in the fun. Dad (Delores Mielke's father) told of one incident which occurred while he was watching a dance from

the sidelines. A big buxom girl from the district where he taught spied him. "Oh teacher!" she cried, "dance with me!" and oblivious of the fact he did not know how to dance, she spun him out on the floor. He claimed his feet never touched the floor again until the music stopped and he was able to escape.

"Monday 11 June 1894, Bratz sold a portion, one and a half rods [a little over 20 feet] wide, to the City of Merrill, presumably for a roadway, making the park more accessible. A broad winding path was built near the south end of the old iron bridge on Park Street. There were two foot bridges near the east end of the path which often were washed away in the spring floods and have since been removed.

"In the early days groups assembled in Merrill, marched together over the bridge and down the path to the park, sometimes accompanied by bands playing lively tunes. There were several small bands in Merrill at that time. Until recent days St. Johns Lutheran Church had its own band.

"There were stands and booths where food and beer were available. Folks brought their own lunches and there was a bandstand for the band. School picnics continued to be held there for many years, certainly up to the 1930's. Teachers and children marched from the school to the park, ate their lunches and enjoyed games and contests. Report cards were passed out at the end of the picnic, probably to ensure that all had a good time even if they failed the grade.

"Monday 14 September 1903 Mr. Bratz sold the 18.8 acre park to the Merrill Park Board for \$1,600. The City has continued to upgrade the facilities for the present use of the park. The southeast part of the hill has provided much gravel for the streets of Merrill." (From "T. B. Scott Mansion," by Delores Chilsen Mielke, published by the Merrill, Wisconsin, Historical Society, 1989.) Gustav became a naturalized citizen on April 9, 1901.

Henrietta died in 1919 and is buried in Merrill. Gustav moved to Seattle, Washington, to follow Aimee Semple McPherson's evangelistic movement centered on the "Foursquare Gospel," and lived in Monroe, Washington, for a period of time.

A 1931 Merrill newspaper article reported "Early Pioneer Visits Scenes of Childhood; Gustav Bratz, formerly owner of property now known as Riverside Park, here from west." It goes on to report: "Scenes of his childhood days and of his early struggles and triumphs as a pioneer Lincoln county farmer nearly seventy-five years ago were being visited this week by Gustav Bratz, 79 years old, formerly of Merrill, but now of Monroe, Washington, who at present is visiting at the homes of his two daughters, Mrs. A. F. Peterman and Mrs. William Wendt.

"Last Sunday Mrs. Wendt took her father, who arrived here Friday for a visit and to take care of some local business, on a ride out to the family's old homestead, in the Town of Berlin, which his father took up when he was only five years old. He took great interest in the trip and remarked that he noticed many changes in the countryside and Merrill since he was here several years ago.

"Our old farm hasn't changed much, though,' he said as he surveyed the old property. 'The old log cabin is gone, and the well -- great water in that well years ago -- has caved in, but that's our barn still standing.

"We built that barn more than fifty years ago and it seems that it may last for fifty more. It seem to be weather-proof enough and every hand-hewn shingle that we put there is still in place.' Down the road a short distance Mr. Bratz stopped to call on his old neighbor, William Hoeft, who is about his age, and the two had a long talk as they exchanged reminiscences of the now dim past. Sunday morning Mr. Bratz renewed many old friendships when he attended the German services at St. Stephen's church.

"While well known in the Town of Berlin, which was his original home in the New World, Mr. Bratz was particularly prominent in Merrill as an ice dealer and as the owner of the first farm in their immediate vicinity. The farm once occupied the present site of the Merrill Golf course and included the present Riverside Park.

"Though he had stated in letters during the summer that he would make the trip here this fall, his Merrill kinfolk did not expect him until he arrived to surprise them because they felt the three-day trip would be too strenuous for one of his advanced years. Mr. Bratz, a lively sort of a dignified old gentleman in spite of his years, admitted that he was a 'bit tired' after the long journey, but a night's rest restored him completely.

"Mr. Bratz expects to spend four or five weeks in Merrill before departing for home by way of Chicago."

Gustav died in Merrill Thursday 1 April 1937. The Merrill newspaper recorded the following

"Pioneer Merrill Resident Dies At Daughter's Home. Gustav Bratz Dies Twelve Hours After Suffering Stroke -- Funeral Next Monday. Gustav Bratz, prominent pioneer resident of this community died at 8 p.m. last night at the home of his daughter, Mrs. A. F. Peterman, 100 Park street, twelve hours after he had suffered a stroke of apoplexy. He was 85 years old. A farmer for many years, Mr. Bratz once owned the land that now encompasses Riverside park. He operated it as a public park for a number of years after the turn of the century. The park was later sold to the Merrill Liederkrantz. Subsequently it was purchased by the city and has since been maintained as a park. From the old Bratz plat, the park has been developed into one of the most beautiful natural parks in the state. Mr. Bratz was born in Germany, August 6, 1852, the son of Henry Bratz and Louise Neuman Bratz who immigrated to this country when he was four years old. The family settled in Marathon county from which Gustav moved into the town of Scott, Lincoln county. Even while he was farming, Mr. Bratz branched into business in this city. For several years he operated an ice delivery company. He was married in 1873 in Marathon county to Henrietta Jacoby, who died in 1919. They had ten children, five of whom survive. The children are Mrs. Peterman, Ernest Bratz, Seattle, Wash.; Mrs. Minnie DeBene, Mrs. Amanda Palm and Mrs. Nina Stift, all of Chicago. Those dead were Mrs. Tillie Wendt, Mrs. Lizzie Edens, Emil, Anna and Lena Bratz. Two brothers and sisters also preceded him in death. Others surviving are 22 grand and 17 great grandchildren. Mr. Bratz was a life long member of St. Stephen's Evangelical church. The funeral will be held at 1:30 p.m. next Monday from the A. F. Peterman residence and at 2 p. m. from St. Stephen's church. the Rev. M. M. Schmidt officiating. Services at the home will be private, but friends may call until the time of the funeral." He is buried in the Merrill Cemetery.

Notes for Henriette Jacobi:

Henriette immigrated to America and settled in Marathon County, Wisconsin, in 1871 when she was about 18 years old. Met Gustav on the boat to America.

Wednesday. Mrs. William Wendt is Survived by her husband, seven children and her aged father. The funeral of Mrs. Tillie Bratz Wendt, wife of William Wendt, who passed away in her Riverside avenue home yesterday afternoon, will be held at 2 p.m. Wednesday from the St John's Lutheran church, the Rev. Walter Sievers, pastor, officiating. Mrs. Wendt, a sufferer from asthma for many years, was taken seriously ill several days ago when her heart began to fail. She lost strength steadily until yesterday when she began to sink rapidly. She passed away at 4:30 p.m. Born June 9, 1881 in the town of Berlin, Marathon county, the daughter of Gustav Bratz and the late Henrietta Jacobi Bratz, she came to this city with her parents when an infant of one year. She was married to William Wendt on Nov. 6, 1901. Seven children born of the union survive with the husband and father. They are Mrs. Ruth Gehrke, Shawano; Mrs. Lorraine Zastrow, Wausau; Lawrence Wendt, Dorothy Wendt, Mrs. Vera Block, Myron Wendt and Wilma Wendt, all of Merrill. Mrs. Wendt also is survived by her father, four sisters, Mrs. A. F. Peterman, Merrill; Mrs. Nick Palm, Mrs. Dan De Bene and Mrs. Fred Stift, all of Chicago, and her brother, Ernest Bratz, Seattle, Wash. A fifth sister, Mrs. Lizzie Edens, preceded her in death. Mrs. Wendt was a devoted member of St. John's Lutheran church and a prominent member of the congregation's Ladies' Aid society and Mission circle."

Notes for William Frank Wendt:

Wilhelm (William) Frank Wendt came to Merrill, Wisconsin, in 1899. There he met Otellie "Tillie" Bratz. They were married Wednesday 6 November 1901 in Merrill.

"His uncle, John Spiegelberg, built two big houses on the South side of the Wisconsin river opposite the dam and an old Grist Mill on the edge of the dam. The Grist Mill, which later became a creamery, was created in 1878 by Herman Rusch and William F. Spiegelberg, who operated it for one year until it was sold to John Wendt and run by William and Albert Wendt." (From a letter to the editor of the Merrill, Wisconsin news-paper by Nina Bratz Stift, August 1984.)

The grist mill first owned by William F. Spiegelberg. Charles F. Spiegelberg became the owner and the flour-making industry was carried on by Spiegelberg Brothers as the Lincoln County Roller Mills. They sold the mill to John Wendt around 1900, after which it was operated by his sons William and Albert Wendt.

William was president of the Merrill Creamery Company, and J. A. Newell was vice president. Newell was said to be one of the pioneer cheese and butter makers of the county and understood the business in all its phases, while Wendt was said to be a good businessman, making for a successful company. Later they bought the defunct Irma (ten miles north of Merrill), Wisconsin, creamery company, in the hope of development of Lincoln county as dairy center. The Merrill Creamery Company was conducted in the eastern part of the grist mill building, the mill proper having been put out of use by the water power rights having been sold to Lindauer Pulp Manufacturing company in 1916. William Wendt operated the Merrill creamery, while Newell operated the Irma creamery.

One winter day three years after William and Albert sold the milling business, William built a fire in the stove of the creamery and left the building to attend to some other work about his farm. A fire started as a result of an overheated stove pipe, and the grist mill and creamery building was completely destroyed by fire. The loss was estimated at over \$8,000, with only \$2,000 of insurance carried.

Sometime later, while hunting "unprotected game" with Albert, William's dog was in pursuit of a fox when the dog was shot and killed by two young men. The "Wendt boys relieved them of their guns" as evidence that they are the ones that killed William's valuable fox dog. William was arrested and charged with petit larceny of a double barrel breach loading shot gun and a repeating Marlin rifle.

An undated newspaper clipping, from about 1920, reports that William "took his Ford with two passengers over the West Fork Road to Clam Lake last Sunday. The trip was made without mishap, other than the usual inconveniences of the condition of the road one traveled. This is the first time an auto has been taken the full distance on this road and is quite an accomplishment, and any one will agree who has ever been over the road."

Monday 16 February 1925, fourteen passengers and the train crew of the "Heineman," a combination freight and passenger train of the Milwaukee Road, escaped serious injury and possible death when two coaches turned over as the result of the train striking a broken rail. This occurred six miles north of Merrill, on the Gleason line near Otis, near what was more familiarly

known as "Camp 2." Eleven freight and logging cars, and two passenger cars bringing up the rear, were traveling at a good rate of speed, when the coaches struck a split rail and were thrown off the track onto their right side.

Before the passengers could make their way to the doors, flames from the stoves and lamps ignited surrounding fixtures and spread with threatening rapidity. William Wendt, who was then connected with the Hieb Manufacturing company, was the most seriously injured, with a broken arm and his face badly cut.

In a July 1930 newspaper article it was reported that William, "caretaker at Riverside Park, is doing a good and painstaking job at that popular and shady retreat. One of the most beautiful natural parks, with thickly wooded hillside along the south and the Wisconsin river flowing along the north, with shaded approaches by roadway or path, neatly attended and entirely relieved of litter or obstruction.

The pavilion is ample, the concrete platform for programs or buildings for the accommodation of gatherings. Mr. Wendt in constant attendance, it is always ready for use, and the public will find the attendant on hand and willing to contribute to the assistance and pleasure of the public at all times."

Tillie died in 1935 and in 1942, William Wendt married Amelia Abraham.

William died in May 1945 in Shawano, Wisconsin, at the home of his daughter, Ruth, and was buried in Merrill. William was survived by brothers Albert of Merrill, Otto of Symco, Wisconsin, Fred of New London and Martin of West Bloomfield, and sister Mrs. Anna Braun of Auroraville, Illinois.

Her desire for getting the precise colors is evidenced by the fact that she once grew a flower garden for the purpost of color accuracy. She once appliqued a pair of twin bed quilts and sold them to a friend who gave them to Mrs. William Paley who passed on the compliment that they were beautiful. (The Paleys were well known and Mr. Paley owned a major radio station at that time in California. Since moving back to Merrill, she became very active in the Merrill Historical Society and the Wisconsin Quilt History Society. One of her quilts called "Magpie Rose Quilt" which was displayed at the Pabst Mansion in Milwaukee.

The record of their wedding reads "against the background of an archway banked with ferns and autumn flowers in the living room of the William Wendt's Riverside Ave. home, Vera Wendt exchanged nuptial vows with Paul Block Saturday evening at eight o'clock, the Rev. W. Sievers officiating. Her sister Dorothy Wendt and cousin Lynda Peterman attended, and Charles Holl, Jr. was the bestman. A reception immediately followed and the couple departed for a wedding trip to the East.

"The couple is well known and popular in Merrill. Paul is employed in Peterman's department store where Vera also held a position until last week. Both are graduates of the local high school and Vera attended Milwaukee State Teachers' College." Paul died Thursday 29 June 1989 in Merrill, and was buried there. There are no children.

The Merrill Courier News, November 8, 2002, reported an interview with Vera: "Merrill Girl Took Chances Over Ice And Under Trains. Vera Block, the daughter of William and Otilie Wendt look a trip back in time, and brought to life the Merrill of her girlhood. The 94-yr-old told how her mother had cautioned her and her siblings, seven in all, not to cross the ice until Thanksgiving Day, The family lived on Riverside Avenue - then Spiegelberg Avenue. The children crossed the dam whenever they could and hoped that Herman Tank, who was in charge of the Public Service dam, wouldn't catch them.

The chilling prospect of falling through the ice was only surpassed by the children's train crossing daredevilry, that of passing under a moving train, albeit. A slow-moving one! What was a student to do?

"You had to get to school on time and if the train was passing you had to get to the other side," said Vera. She shuddered to think what her mother would have done had she known about it. There was a small house, owned by a Mr. Riebe, said Vera, on Park Street by the railroad tracks. Sometimes he would let the children warm their feet there before pressing on to school.

A gristmill had been built in 1879 by Herman Rusch and William Spiegelberg (Vera's grandmother's brother). John Wendt, Vera's grandfather, purchased the mill in 1879. It was run by William and Al Wendt, Vera's uncle. The mill, known as Lincoln County Roller Mills, was located on Spiegelberg Avenue which was later renamed Riverside Avenue, because, as Vera put it, "the ritzy people thought it should be renamed." Vera thinks it should return to its original name. In 1888. Peter Loysen ran the mill. One half of the flourmill became the Merrill Creamery Company.

Vera recalled the electric trolley, one of the first in the U.S., which ran east to west in Merrill. She said that at the end of the line it was necessary for the streetcar operator to get atop it to reverse its direction. As a young woman, Vera's mother Otilie, used it to ride her horse alongside the trolley, and the horse would race it.

When Vera attended high school, the structure had an upstairs and downstairs levels for classrooms. Vera liked gym class or Phy. Ed. Her father remarked to his children that "Nowadays all the kids ride to school, and their first class is gym. You kids got your exercise by walking." Vera got lots of exercise because many a day she left class during lunch hour, ran home and had lunch,

then hurried back to school. Sometimes lunch would be a nickel's worth of peanut butter, purchased at Warzinski's store on Park Street and put into a wooden "boat," according to Vera and applied to homemade bread.

The attire of that time for Vera was dresses and, in order to keep feet dry during those long treks to school, mid-calf galoshes. A knit sweater and crocheted wool cap helped chills at bay during the long Wisconsin winters.

"I don't believe we ever had less than eight to ten feet of snow during those days," said Vera of the snowstorms.

Vera recalled that her mother in thinking ahead to her own passing, requested not to be taken to the funeral home, then on Main Street, for embalming. That procedure took place in back of the building, by the train tracks. She feared rats might be roaming around that area. Her mother's request was respected and she was instead embalmed in their own home, said Vera.

When Vera had married, her husband Paul sold automobiles, in particular, the Graham Paige. Vera said she walked down what is now County Highway K toward Mosinee, and she would meet him coming toward Merrill. They would then drive back together. Was she afraid to walk alone? No, she said, because the road was being worked on, and there were workers around.

The roads were often mucky and miry and close to impassable at times. In the hot, dry summer, Vera said her Grandfather Bratz watered down the streets to keep the dust down.

Merrill has come a long way since those days. Sometimes it takes someone who's been around for nearly a century of change to make that point."
